People are often quick to bag up fallen leaves as if they're a problem. But they aren't. They are the foundation of healthy soil. Left on the ground, leaves break down into nutrient-rich organic matter. They feed trees, insulate roots from extreme weather, and even provide shelter for pollinators. In other words, they're one of nature's simplest, free gifts. And all it takes is leaving them where they are.

Note from Dave: However rake them off your lawn or shred them with a mower on a high setting as complete leaves can damage the grass by not letting light in, and also brush them off paths etc. as they can become slippery in winter. # **THOUGHTS & PRAYERS FOR TODAY**

Question: Are modern day prayers better than ones from the past? Not always:

On Sunday 12<sup>th</sup>, Rev Steve Levett, taking the Communion Service at Catshill, started with what is known as the Collect for Purity, and suggested it was a good one for us to learn in addition to the Lord's Prayer. It is believed to originate, in Latin, from the 10<sup>th</sup> century, and Thomas Cranmer, one time Archbishop of Canterbury during the reigns of Henry VIII, Edward VI and, for a short time, Mary I in the 16<sup>th</sup> century, is credited as translating the prayer into English. The prayer is:

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

...and here's one from the 12<sup>th</sup> century:

We offer you our hands, O Lord, to do your work, our lips to sing your praise, our life to proclaim your glory and our heart to serve you in our neighbourhood; for Jesu's sake. Amen.
